Educational Requirements of Psychologists and Related Specialties

As to the regulatory requirements applicable to mental health professionals:

- A Licensed Psychologist must hold a doctorate degree in psychology and have at least one year of post-doctoral supervision. An ABPP Board Certified Psychologist must additionally have year(s) of in-depth post-graduate training and education in the specialty, and then pass national written and oral examinations in the specialty conducted by peers in the specialty area.
- A Licensed Clinical Social Worker, a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist, and a Licensed Professional Counselor must hold a master's degree in their profession and have two years of post-masters supervision. A Licensed Social Worker must hold a master's degree in social work. A Psychologist Candidate, a Marriage and Family Therapist Candidate, and a Licensed Professional Counselor Candidate must hold the necessary licensing degree and be in the process of completing the required supervision for licensure.
- A Certified Addiction Counselor I (CAC I) must be a high school graduate, and complete required training

hours and 1,000 hours of supervised experience. A CAC II must complete additional required training hours and 2,000 hours of supervised experience. A CAC III must have a bachelor's degree in behavioral health, and complete additional required training hours and 2,000 hours of supervised experience. A Licensed Addiction Counselor must have a clinical master's degree and meet the CAC III requirements.

- A Registered Psychotherapist is registered with the State Board of Registered Psychotherapists, is not licensed or certified, and no degree, training or experience is required.
- A licensed Psychiatrist must hold a medical or osteopathic degree, and have completed a one year internship and a residency in psychiatry.

Patient Rights Information

- The practice of psychologists is regulated by the Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies; Division of Professions and Occupations: Board of Psychologist Examiners, 1560 Broadway Avenue #1350, Denver, CO 80202. Phone: 303-894-7800.
- You are entitled by law to receive information about methods and treatment, the nature of any clinical techniques used, the duration of planned care (if known), and about your doctor's fee schedule.
- Psychology, like medicine, is not an exact science. Neuropsychological assessment involves interviewing and often administration of tests and procedures which attempt to assess a person's functioning in various areas such as memory, concentration, reasoning, visual perception, language, motor coordination, and personality and mood. For optimal benefit and results, these tests require maximum cooperation and active effort on the patient's part.
- You may always seek a second opinion, and may terminate any elective treatment with any practitioner at any time.
- In a professional relationship, sexual intimacy is never appropriate and should be reported to the professional's respective licensing, registration, or certification board. Such activity is unethical and/or illegal.
- Your communications with a psychologist are confidential, except as provided in Section 12-43-218 and the Notice of Privacy Rights you were provided. For example, psychologists are required to report child abuse to authorities. If such an exception arises during the course of your clinical encounter, you will be informed.
